# Adapting the latest evidence of patient centred approach in TB patient care - Way forward in the Baltic countries

Working in 3 groups: Streamline the "people-centred model of TB care" in country models of care. Action points for discussions for each country:

1) adoption of rapid tests and changes in the treatment guidelines (which regimens we take, what should be changed, which tests we will use in which sequence);

2) patient empowerment, and education (involving patients in decision making, monitoring process, improving communication with patients to gain trust);

3) digital health solutions for adherence and patient empowerment (e.g. apps, 99 DOTs, self-monitoring tools).
